

Autumn

- Look at UN human rights & we are all born free. Create a spectrum for importance of each right and debate
- Raise monarchy – Look at National Anthem. Make up of royal family. Why has Megan Markle marrying Prince Harry been significant? Future King and qualities to be a King.
- Citizenship – Action – Passive support or promotion. Look at recent campaigns in news. Consider what campaign you could create. Draw up idea for in school campaign.
- Citizens actions – volunteering. Look at charity types & what they support. Select preferred charities and why.
- Study Elizabeth Fry – importance of education for prisoners. Reinforce need to be able to react? Why is this most important skill? Create instructions for how to read and strategies to use.

Spring

- Revise Human Rights illustrate a mind map of Human Rights in Action e.g. a nurse caring for patient. Teacher teaching – incredible freedoms & contributions.
- Study Magna Carta (foundation for equality). Research history of the signing of Magna Carta. Other examples of people who fought for justice.
- Create campaign method to create advertising, poster, badges.
- Citizen Actions – Decide on own volunteering project that can be done in community – Plan & prepare to execute

Summer

- Revise rule of laws civil/criminal. Court System. What is role of judge, jury, magistrate how is jury compiled. Lawyers. Create a pretend trial.
- Study Mahatma Ghandi. Religion – views and beliefs. Tolerance.
- Carry out campaign as force for positive change of school – speeches for classes, presentations for leadership.
- Review volunteering project. Citizen actions can support others in different ways. How else could you make a difference? Create a school petition for positive action.
