

# SHIREMOOR PRIMARY UNIFORM POLICY



**Daily school uniform: (Uniform can have the school logo but this is not necessary)**

- Royal blue sweatshirt or blue cardigan.
- Plain white shirt, t-shirt or polo top.
- Black school trousers, tracksuit bottoms/leggings with no logos.
- Black skirts or pinafores.
- Children can wear black trainers, shoes or boots. They should be plain black in colour (All shoes and boots should be flat with no heel for safety reasons).
- Summer uniform adaptations: black shorts/gingham blue school dress/ gingham blue shorts

**In addition:**

- No logos other than school logo to be on clothing.
- No jewellery to be worn for health and safety reasons, apart from small ear studs. Children must be able to remove their earrings, or plasters must be provided. We cannot provide plasters.

**Hair:**

- Hair should look natural in appearance - no extreme colours of hairstyles.
- Any hair accessories should be black in colour.
  
- Makeup, nail polish or false nails are not permitted.

**P.E.**

- Plain black shorts for indoor/hot weather or black joggers for cold weather.
- Plain white t-shirt.
- Footwear for P.E. must be appropriate and safe. P.E. is compulsory and if footwear is not appropriate, children will be given sandshoes to wear.

The DFE state: 'Teachers can discipline pupils for breaching school rules on appearance or uniform'

In consultation with you, we agree that sending children home for uniform breach is just learning time wasted and so these will be the stages for non-compliance of uniform.

**Stage 1** - Class teacher will speak to the child in the first instance to remind them of appropriate uniform items. (This will be done discreetly)

**Stage 2** - Class teacher will speak to the parent to remind them of the policy.

**Stage 3** - Child will be given spare uniform/shoes to change into.

**Stage 4** - Formal meeting with parents with a member of the Senior Team.

If there is a reason why your child cannot wear any of the clothing above, please speak to one of the Senior Team for advice and support.
